2008 Bond Update

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**



The 2008 LISD bond election requested voter approval for \$697.7 million in funding to build more schools for a rapidly growing student population and to repair and upgrade its aging portfolio of school buildings.



### **TIMELINE**

The future is difficult to predict. Several unforeseen changes in the forecast led to reevaluation of the bond funds allocations.



### IMPACT OF THE 2008 ECONOMIC CRASH

**Enrollment growth slowed.** To best serve students and make the best use of the bond funds, LISD reevaluated project priorities to align with new and unforeseen realities driven by economic conditions.

**Some funds were reallocated** from growth-driven investment toward more pressing concerns needing to be addressed in future bond programs.


All decisions have been made in the long-term best interests of LISD students and taxpayers.



### **BUDGET REALLOCATION**

- Projects were completed both <u>over and under budget</u> due to unanticipated facility improvement requirements (ex. foundation issues, cost of abatement, code requirements), construction costs and staff/student needs.
- Rather than build new space that would be left unoccupied, funds originally slated for these projects were reallocated to address serious facility issues, including the rebuild of Lewisville High School.
- Project savings were reallocated to address other pressing facility issues that would have needed to be addressed in future bond programs.

### **Projected Impact:**


13 pennies per \$100 of value \$250 per year on a \$200,000 home

### **Seniors 65 or Over**


No tax impact to senior citizens who were 65 or older when the bonds were approved in 2008. Tax rates are frozen the year you turn 65.







### Acquire Future School Sites

Initial Budget: \$26,800,000

Cost Estimate:

\$19,084,754

(Savings Reallocated)

So far, approximately \$9,700,000 invested in property for:

- Lewisville High School Harmon 9th/10th-grade campus
- Flower Mound High School sports complex
- Marcus High School 9th grade campus
- Future school site on Josey Lane just south of Hwy.
   121

The remaining budget is still allotted to land acquisition.

### Capital Improvements

Initial Budget: Final Investment:

\$63,500,00 \$113,458,866

(Used Reallocated Funds)

Capital improvements were made district-wide on items such as flooring, roof repair/replacement, HVAC upgrades, playground upgrades, asbestos removal, restroom upgrades and more.

The most substantial investments were made at Degan ES, Garden Ridge ES, Hedrick ES, Morningside ES, Timbercreek ES, Arbor Creek MS and Forestwood MS.

### Technology Infrastructure & Equipment

Initial Budget: \$63,000,000

Final Investment: \$103,014,082 (Used Reallocated Funds)



- ✓ Added 4,500 Wi-Fi access pts
- ✓ Laid 265 miles of copper cable
- ✓ Increased bandwidth to 7GB minimum at all 65 campuses
- Restructured IT support staff
- Purchased current technology for students and staff
